Activities of the Parish Council

The Parish of Audley is the largest in area in the District of Newcastle-under-Lyme, covering some 2717 hectares. The Parish has a population of around 8000 and comprises 7 distinctly separate villages and many small hamlets. Audley Rural Parish Council is a statutory elected local authority, which acts as a voice for local opinion by keeping in close and regular contact with its electorate and provides a focus for voluntary organisations in the area. The Parish Council comprises of three wards: Audley, Bignall End and Halmer End which are represented by a total of 15 councillors, who volunteer their time on an unpaid basis:

POWERS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

From December 2012, the Parish Council has greater powers to do things under the General Power of Competence in the Localism Act 2011. There is an annual budget of approx. £50k (although this has increased during 2016/17 to raise funds for play equipment). The budget is raised through the Council Tax (precept) plus a contribution from the Borough Council, which is used to provide and maintain a number of things across the Parish such as:

- 🛡️ Bus shelters
- 🛡️ 2 car parks
- 🛡️ 2 war memorials
- 🛡️ 8 notice boards
- 🛡️ 8 playing fields and play areas
- 🛡️ 75 seats across the Parish
- 🛡️ Footpaths within land in the ownership of the Parish Council
- 🛡️ Bowling Clubs
- 🛡️ 80 allotment plots
- 🛡️ 2 wildlife areas

When necessary, the Parish Council also work with a number of partners to address issues raised which are outside of their control such as the village centre car parks and parking issues and anti-social behaviour.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

Newcastle Borough Council is the local planning authority for this area. Legally the Borough does not have a statutory obligation to consult with the Parish Council but does so because it has a policy of consulting widely on planning applications made to it. The Parish Council is given the opportunity to make its opinions known and to bring to the attention of the Borough Council local issues of which officers may not be aware. It is the duty of the Parish Council generally to represent the views and concerns of all residents of the parish of Audley, by drawing on the local knowledge of councillors to reflect the concerns and opinions of residents. If you have a concern about an issue or a specific planning application, there are several steps you can take.

- Raise the matter with a Parish Councillor or the clerk. Your concerns will then be raised at the meeting when the application is discussed.
- You have the right to attend the planning meeting yourself and raise your concerns during the public participation session at the start of the meeting.
- Most importantly you must make your concerns with regard to a specific planning application known directly to the Borough Council, as it is this body that finally determines the application.
- If a planning application has significant implications in the local area parishioners are advised to submit individual objections to the Borough Council.

A petition only counts as one objection, regardless of the number of signatures it contains. Most applications are determined by officers of the council, who interpret the requirements of the Local Plan, but the Parish Council works closely with the Borough Councillors representing the Parish. They are able to "call in" applications for determination by the Planning Committee when there is serious local concern.
